No. 401 s.s. "Titanic".

No doubt it has been reported to you that one of the cross channel steamers passed the above vessel about 12.15 p.m. yesterday, at a high rate of speed, causing the "Titanic" to range heavily on her moorings, and one of the 5" long fore and aft springs parted, causing the wire hawser to fall suddenly on one of the scows on which several men were working, which, of course, was most dangerous, as some of the men narrowly escaped being killed and knocked into the water.

We may further say that recently we have observed that the mid-day channel steamers frequently pass this vessel at too high a rate of speed, which was especially the case when these Works were closed for holidays last week.

We shall be glad if you will please take the necessary steps to prevent a recurrence, and we shall be glad to have your assurance accordingly.
